Minnesota Early Childhood Screening -- Do Ahead of Age 4

Minnesota State Law requires that children at the age of 3 years participate in a developmental early childhood screening. The purpose of the screening is to identify health and learning delays, but is not intended to substitute for care from your family physician, dentist or other provider. It consists of the following components: fine/gross motor skills, language development, concepts, height/weight, vision, hearing, review of child's health history and immunization records. Children on the Luverne preschool census receive invites for the screening. **The next screening date for the Luverne School District will be September 20 and January 24, 2025.** If your child is 4 years old and has not been screened, please call 283-4724 to set up a screening time.

FamilyU After School Child Care (Kdg - Grade 5)

This child care program, which runs year-round for students in grades K- 5, is located in the **Elementary School Multi-Purpose Area**. Care is provided from **3:15 to 5:30 on school days and continues full days during the summer months in conjunction with Community Education’s Morning Rec program**. No care is provided during holiday breaks, on all-day inservice days or on days when school is dismissed early because of weather.

Children participate in games, arts and crafts, character building and self-esteem activities. Children play outside daily, weather permitting. During the school year, time is set aside for homework and reading. During the summer, field trips, swimming lessons, library outings and more are planned into each week.

Program fee during the school year is \$40/week. During the summer, rates are \$110/week for the half days during the weeks of Morning Rec and \$155/week for the weeks of full days. There is an additional summer activity fee. (Be sure to register for Morning Rec at Community Ed in May after the summer brochure comes out). Payments are due every 2 weeks in advance.



Registrations are accepted throughout the year if there are openings. Names may be placed on a wait list for available openings with a 2 week non-refundable deposit fee that will be applied to your first child care payment. First priority is given to year round care, then school year care. During the last week of May, if there are no summer openings, the deposit fee will be refunded. During the last week of August, if there are no school year openings, the deposit fee will be refunded.
